ROADS

We consider the exit from the Drive into steeple road is extremely dangerous. The reason being motor vehicles do not slow down early enough when approaching the village exit. This is particularly noticeable and dangerous when exiting vehicles are turning out towards Latchingdon as our vehicles are sideways on to oncoming traffic. If an approaching vehicle is just out of sight round the corners and as frequently happens are going too fast they are almost on to the exiting vehicle from the village turn off before it is clear and thus safe.

Recommendations: quadruple the distances from where the warning signs and road markings start. Reduce the speed limit by another 10 miles per hour. Put in rumble strips and also add permanent flash up speed warning indicators.

Also it is noticeable that vehicles are parked dangerously close to the junction in the Drive. This causes outgoing vehicles to be in the middle of the road when unsighted vehicles turn into the Drive.

Recommendations: Extend substantially the yellow no parking lines leading in and out of the village.

We understand this will inconvenience the few houses near the junction but it will be worth it for safety sake. It is suggested the village contributes to extra hard standing on the houses grass over areas to compensate for the mutual good.

Recommendations: No advertising boards should be allowed adjacent to these junctions as they distract and stop low vehicles drivers such as sports cars.

Advertising boards should at no time be allowed on the footpaths near the shops as they endanger villagers with walking difficulties.

SEAWALL

The temporary steps that were fitted on to the sea wall near the end of North drive should be made a permanent feature. Otherwise residents with walking difficulties find it impossible to access our wonderful amenity.
