145 Planning

The following applications were considered and comment to the Planning Authority agreed:-

Extension to existing outbuilding 8 Promenade, Mayland

2 Against and 5 for this proposal. Therefore, the recommendation to MDC is to raise no objection. Comment added that this building is not to be used for commercial purposes.

Outline planning application with all matters reserved except for primary means of access landscaping, highways, drainage and other infrastructure works Land West of David Fisher Way, Southminster

- There are limited/no school places or provision to cater for current housing in the Dengie Also insufficient doctors or dentists in the area
- The services for Gas, Electricity and Water are sufficient currently, but what extra capacity can they take? Sewage is a particular issue. There is limited capacity at all nearby plants for extra housing.
- The nearest hospital with an A&E is Chelmsford. Ambulance waiting times are at an all-time high.
- Road traffic will increase around the Southminster/Burnham areas. The Dengie is served by just 2 routes. ie. Latchingdon and the lower Burnham road causing a danger to life with the inability of emergency services to get trough at peak times and when roadworks are in progress.
- Other points raised include the effect on the landscape, the environment, the local wildlife, the carbon footprint of this development, the increased risk of flooding and excess surface water and lastly employment.

Change of use from agricultural building to 2 bedroom bungalow (C3 use) and alterations to fenestration

Land North West of Riversleigh, Nipsells Chase, Mayland

All objected to this proposal. Therefore, the recommendation to MDC is the refusal of this proposal. The following reasons are given:

- Original planning was granted for the bungalow on a Live/Work basis.
- To change the use would allow bungalow to be separated from the agricultural use relating to the "Apple Barn"
- This would allow its sale as a private dwelling
- Approval of this would not only set a precedent, but severely damage the integrity of MDC who allowed this build purely as Live/Work agricultural use.
- This would also conflict with:
 - a) S1 Sustainable Development
 - b) S2 Strategic Growth
 - c) S8 Settlement Boundaries and countryside

- d) E1 Employment
- e) H7 Agriculture and essential workers accommodation

148 Lawling Park Committee including Bakersfield, Lawling Playing Field & Dog Walk Area

- Tennis Court Refurbishment Tarmac still needs to be completed on double court. To then raise money for astraturf on top of asphalt. Football club confirmed they would use court for practise.
- Quote for football goals Cllr Spires proposed to look into options for goals at each end
 of single court. Cllr Bush seconded. All in favour. Clerk to make enquiries with other
 parishes.
- Quote for replacing floodlight bulbs Long term plan is to change all the bulbs as the ones in there are out of date. Clerk to look at other options.
- Floodlight meters to switches Discussion over meters. Need press switches. To look into.
- Water Treatment charges Need risk assessment to be able to test water ourselves. Cllr Harding proposed to carry out testing ourselves. Cllr Spires seconded. All in favour.

- Cllr Haywood went through plans for Coronation and who was attending.
- Cllr Haywood proposed to purchase a ton bag of shingle up to the value of £100 for the Nature reserve in Nipsells chase to help with the muddy paths. Cllr Harding seconded this. All in favour.
